

## Final scoping report released for citrus expansion

The Final Scoping Report has been released for the proposed expansion of existing citrus cultivation near Addo that will create an additional 325 seasonal employment opportunities and 25 permanent ones.

San Miguel Fruits SA (Pty) Ltd proposes to clear a minimum of 300 hectares of land for the additional citrus cultivation in phases over four years.

It will be spread over three farms and form part of the existing River Bend Citrus farming operations.

The affected properties are currently zoned for agriculture and therefore will not require rezoning.

The capital investment for the project prior to the harvesting of the crop for export is put at approximately R68 million.
